

Create a Poster Presentation Tracy Derrell

This project is inspired by some of the art and texts you studied during this unit. . Choose a topic you feel strongly about. Some possible examples include bullying, healthy eating and exercising, safe and responsible use of social media and the Internet, and working hard in school. You are not limited to this list. However, you should choose a topic you feel will educate and persuade your audience, which will consist of your peers.

Steps:

- 1) Identify your topic.
- 2) Create your poster. Your poster can be any size, but larger is better. Your poster should include both text and images. If you prefer not to draw or paint, you can create a collage using computer-generated images and pictures from magazines and newspapers. Your final product should be visually attractive with a persuasive message.
- 3) Write your speech, which should be about five minutes in length. During your speech, you want to provide evidence to support the idea in your poster.
- 4) Find a friend or family member to view your poster and listen to your speech.
